The following records were accepted during November 2016

African Spoonbill Platalea alba

One at various locations on a 5 kilometre stretch of tidal flats from Providence, Mahé to a tidal stream near L'Ecole Française, Victoria, Mahé from 5 October to 24 November 2016 (L Soerensen, N Bomholt, M van Dinther, C Onezia, J Souyave, S Agricole, AP Skerrett, A Rocamora).

This is the first record for Seychelles.
